- Cultural values
- Moral

Out-put aspects of trust

- Quality of government processes (Rothstein 2008)
- Specific support (Easton 1975)
- Impartiality,
- Efficiency
- Bureaucratic output factor



Our Data:

- National survey «Chinese Perceptions of Distributive Justice and Fairness»
- Implemented late 2014
- 2500 respondents
- Cooperation between Fafo, Harvard, Peking University (RCCC) and UiB
- Funded by the Norwegain Research Council and Norwegain Ministry of Foreign affairs


«What aspects of trust you take into consideration when evaluating trust in government» (central and local)




Aspects of trust for local government

Central government


- 1. Motivation to serve the people

Local government


- 1. Policy effect/output

Conclusions

- Input aspects of trust matter most for trust in central government
- Output aspects of trust matter most for trust in local government
- High trust in central government is linked to input aspects of trust
- Very little distinction between high and low trusters in local government
